— for achievement and contributions to the development of codes and standards (*Nominations due Nov.1*)

Dennis L. Tewksbury Award

— for contributions to the Structural Engineering Institute (*Nominations due Nov.1*)

President's Award

— to recognize contributions to the success of the Structural Engineering Institute

Gene Wilhoite Award

— for achievement in the art and science of transmission line engineering (*Nominations due Oct.1*)

And Structural Awards from ASCE:

ASCE State-of-the-Art of Civil Engineering Award

— to recognize papers of exceptional merit (*Nominations due Nov.1*)

Collingwood Prize

—for papers by authors under 35 years of age, describing engineering work or recording investigations contributing to engineering knowledge (*Nominations due Feb.1*)

Jack E. Cermak Award

—for achievement in the field of wind engineering and industrial aerodynamics (*Nominations due Nov.1*)

Shortridge Hardesty Award

—for achievement in the field of structural stability (*Nominations due Nov.1*)

Ernest E. Howard Award

—for achievement in advancing the field of structural engineering through research, planning, design, construction, or methods and materials (*Nominations due Nov.1*)

Walter L. Huber Civil Engineering Research Prizes

—for notable achievements in research related to civil engineering (*Nominations due Oct.1*)

T.Y. Lin Award

—to recognize achievement in the field of prestressed concrete (*Nominations due Nov.1*)

Moisseiff Award

— to recognize a paper contributing to structural design (*Nominations due Nov.1*)

Nathan M. Newmark Medal

—to recognize achievement in the field of structural mechanics (*Nominations due Nov.1*)

Alfred Noble Prize

—to recognize a technical paper of exceptional merit by an author 35 years of age or younger (*Nominations due Oct.1*)

Norman Medal and J. James R. Croes Medal

—for contributions to engineering science (*Nominations due Nov.1*)

Raymond C. Reese Research Prize

—to recognize a paper that describes a notable achievement in research related to structural engineering, and how the results can be applied (*Nominations due Nov.1*)

Arthur M. Wellington Prize

—to recognize a paper related to transportation, foundations, or other related subjects (*Nominations due Nov.1*)

George Winter Award

—to recognize achievement in research, education, or practice in addition to making contributions to the social and artistic needs of the community (*Nominations due Nov.1*)
